

Accurate Information

It is your responsibility to provide accurate answers on your financial aid application (FAFSA).

If you find information that is not accurate, you must correct that information through the federal FAFSA process agency through the [online FAFSA web site](#) or by making corrections on a paper Student Aid Report.

If you were not asked to provide tax returns to the Boise State Financial Aid Office and if you used estimated tax return information when filing your FAFSA, as soon as you complete your federal tax return, make corrections to any wrong information on your FAFSA by going to the online FAFSA (www.fafsa.ed.gov).

Remember: asset amounts are reported as of the day you filed your FAFSA. They cannot be updated.

If you provided tax returns and the verification worksheet to our office, we will correct for you any errors in your income information, your family size/number in college information, and in your untaxed income. When you receive information from the federal processor that corrections have been made, go to the FAFSA web site to look at the changes that were made. If you don't understand those changes, contact Boise State's Financial Aid Office.
